The OHE is a London based economic research and consultancy organisation, founded in 1962. Our scope is international and our funder and client portfolio spans all three sectors: public, private and charitable. The OHE analyses the economics and policy of: (1) health care systems, (2) pharmaceutical and other life sciences industries, and (3) health technology assessment.

The Head of Operational Research and Data Analytics takes a role in all three areas of: advice to the ABPI, research and consultancy. Core tasks include the provision of analytical support to the ABPI and OHE Consulting projects and conducting research. More generally, the Head of Operational Research and Data Analytics is expected to provide leadership to an exciting and expanding programme of quantitative research being undertaken at OHE, including all aspects of survey design and primary data collection; analysis of large secondary data sets; oversight of statistical and econometric analysis; and modelling. As a senior member of the OHE team, the Head of Operational Research and Data Analytics will also be expected to develop their own programme of specialist research, including applying for research grants to support that work.

Candidates should have:

- Postgraduate degree in Operational Research, Management Science, Statistics or a similar quantitative field
- Strong data collection and statistical analysis skills
- Fluency in statistical packages such as STATA, R, SPSS and SAS and fluency in MS Access and Excel
- Exceptional accuracy and attention to detail in work
- Ability to explain statistical data and research results to a wide variety of audiences
- Knowledge of the UK health care system
- Track record of publishing original research
- Experience of working with large datasets
- A background of working with both academic and commercial organisations
